Traditionally extending from October to March, the rainy season in Zimbabwe has been progressively delayed, often not beginning until December these days. This delay prevents wildlife from accessing essential resources, leading to increased clashes between animals and humans. Lions, hyenas, and other creatures have wandered into villages in search of food. The nation's elephants have been particularly impacted by the droughts. A 2020 report identified drought as a driving force behind a bacterial infection that killed 35 elephants. Despite efforts to pump water from underground reservoirs, these won't provide enough water to support wildlife survival through the drought, which is expected to continue well into this year.
